What Makes a Trained Leader?



Adult leaders are considered trained once they have completed **Youth Protection Training** and the required courses listed below. Once trained, they may wear the official *Trained* emblem on the left sleeve.

Required Training

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>ALL LEADERS</u></p> <p>Youth Protection Training: required for all registered adults. Must be re-taken at least every 2 years.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>CUB SCOUT LEADERS</u></p> <p>Specific training for every Cub Scouting role is offered. If a change in leadership position occurs, the leader must take the training for that position.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tiger, Wolf and Bear Leaders: Den Leader Position-Specific Training. • Webelos Den Leaders: Den Leader Position-Specific Training for Webelos Leaders • Cubmaster and Assistant Cubmaster Position Specific Training • Pack Committee Position Specific Training—Pack Committee Challenge

Supplemental Training

There is a myriad of extra training: some for edification, some required for certain events. Partial list below.

<p><u>CUB LEADERS</u></p> <p>BALOO: Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation: Required to have at least 1 adult with BALOO training on a Pack overnight camping trip. Recommend that at least 2 adults have training since if 1 can't attend, the camping shouldn't occur.</p> <p>Rangemaster Training: BBs and Archery at and Council camps are led by volunteers. Leaders who have received this training lead these events, otherwise, they won't occur. Recommend at least 1 leader in each pack have this training.</p> <p>Webelos Outdoor Leaders Training: Required for Webelos Dens/Patrols to go camping on their own. Webelos and their leaders are encouraged to go camping without the pack.</p>	<p><u>GENERAL</u></p> <p>University of Scouting: Day filled with many classes. Participant can choose which classes to take. Some are BSA syllabus for training, others are skills, ideas, crafts, etc. Counts toward Training Awards in lieu of Roundtable.</p> <p>Wood Badge: premier leadership BSA training course. Learn tools in listening, communicating, conflict management, project planning and leading change; to better understand and leverage diversity and generational differences; to have the leadership skills to be a better Scout Leader for the youth's benefit.</p> <p>Power Horn: provides an intro to the resources needed to lead youth through a program of outdoor/high-adventure. The course presenters are expert consultants in each activity. It is not a certification event. It is for any youth or adult interested in experiencing a unit-level, high-adventure program.</p> <p>College of Commissioner Science: Once a year, full-day of specialized classes for Unit Commissioners and Roundtable Commissioners.</p> <p>The Fundamentals of Training & The Trainers EDGE: classes to improve one's ability to train others. Skills, methods and best practices of training. Especially recommended for Pack/Troop Trainers.</p>
<p><u>BOY SCOUT LEADERS</u></p> <p>Archery, Rifle, Shotgun, Climbing/COPE: To lead these activities or Merit Badges, leaders must have the appropriate training.</p>
